According to the Federal Research Centre for Forests, nearly half of Austria's forests are small private forests, each with less than 200 hectares. Overall, there are around 1.6 million hectares of forest with 1.5 billion trees, and counting. The maintenance of these forests requires not only a lot of time, but also the necessary expertise. "In forest management, it's not just about yield, but maintenance too. Proper thinning makes the forest healthier and more steadfast in adverse weather conditions. At the same time, more wood grows than in an unmanaged forest, which is good for the environment and also secures the value of the forest for the future", explains Norbert Hüttler, Director Wood Procurement for Central Europe at Stora Enso.



Private forest owners benefit from advice, purchasing, development

Current studies show that wood which is used as a building material has a much better CO2 balance than if it remains unused in the forest. This effect arises from the fact that if wood is used then, on the one hand, less plastic, concrete or metal needs to be produced and, on the other hand, new wood can be grown in the forest and can then store CO2. As long as more is grown in the forest than is felled, the use of wood makes a considerable contribution towards climate protection.

"By managing their forests sustainably, forest owners benefit not only themselves but the environment, too.
